## **10. SEARCH ROOM LIBRARY**

We have received transcripts of Eynesbury parish registers 1538-1950 from Huntingdonshire Family History Society, and of monumental inscriptions for Bythorn and Hamerton church and churchyards and St Ives Quaker burial ground by Mike Stephenson and Caroline Kessler. ## **LOCAL STUDIES TEAM REPORT APRIL - SEPTEMBER 2010**

### **Cambridgeshire Collection, Cambridge Library**

1.1: Two core activities throughout this period were working with both internal and external partners on a variety of outreach events (as reported elsewhere) and on cataloguing recent accessions. The former involved working with library colleagues, Christ's College, the Cambridge Philatelic Society, Cambridgeshire Records Society, Cambridge & County Folk Museum, and Cambridge University. The latter to catch up with accessions acquired during Fiona Parish's absence on extended leave and also deal with the acquisition of a significant number of archaeological reports and parish register fiche. Some 539 items being catalogued during the six months.

1 .2: Previous partnership work also resulted in Chris Jakes being invited by the Cambridge University Press Bookshop to a concert in Trinity College Chapel and by the Shelford Oral History Group to the launch of "Shelford's Wars".

Chris Jakes has been working with Phil Walker of Iliffe Digital who are considering digitising the back files of the Cambridge News Group newspapers. Examples of the national and international use of the Collection during this period are visits by Prof. P. Marstoir, Washington State University, researching\*James Clerk Maxwell (and presenting us with a copy of one of his papers on Maxwell), tlenifer Bruton, Brigham Young University, writing a dissertation on children in wartime

Cambridge (and presenting us with a copy), author Midge Gillies researching a forthcoming publication on the experiences of Far Eastern Prisoners of War, and EMI Music contacting us for the programme and reviews of "Beyond the Fringe" performed at the Arts Theatre, Cambridge in 1961 . (They plan to re-issue a recording of the performance on the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary).

## **2. Huntingdonshire Collection, Huntingdon Library**

2.1: Caroline Clifford continues to work closely with Lesley Akeroyd and other Archives colleagues to promote the joint service in Huntingdon through a variety of outreach activities (as reported elsewhere). The visitor figures for Huntingdonshire Archives reflect their success and also the benefits of being located in the new Library and Archives building.

2.2: Caroline Clifford has been working with Madeleine Forrester of the BBC and other partners to see how we can promote both the forthcoming BBC series on High Street History and our own collections.

## **3. Fenland Collection, Wisbech Library**

3.1: Alison England has throughout this period successfully managed and mentored Adam Bass who has been working at Wisbech Library and the Wisbech and Fenland Museum under the Future Jobs Scheme. He has gained useful work experience and contributed to the work of the Fenland Collection.

3.2: Alison England has organised and delivered successful workshops for school groups at March and Wisbech libraries.

3.3: Wisbech Library was officially opened on 19<sup>th</sup> June and Alison England produced a series of displays and activities for visitors throughout the day promoting Archives and Local Studies.

## **4. Notable Accessions**

4.1: The Cambridgeshire Collection has received:-

- 148 parish register microfiche from the Cambridgeshire Family History Society.
- Two sketch books by Charles L Bell 1876-1883 containing descriptions and sketches of many buildings and churches in Cambridgeshire from the Cambridge Antiquarian Society.
- A Great War scrapbook compiled by Christine Barthes, French teacher at the Perse Girls School, including local postcards, wartime concert programmes and a signed letter from Rudyard Kipling.
- Mary Greene's unpublished autobiography "The joy of remembering: reminiscences of a Cambridge artist". We received permission from the Greene Family to copy this.
