I have just received a very convincing looking email supposedly from Amazon about changes to my recent order.

Although I use Amazon a lot, I do not currently have an order with them, when I checked the link it was obviously a scam trying to get me to link to a rogue site.

It is very easy to check whether a link in an email is genuine

Just hover the cursor over the link and it will reveal its destination, if it looks nothing like what the email purports to be about simply **delete it**.

Try it with this below on the following link, it says it is for **Dog Food**, but you will see the exact link is for quite the opposite

Please click here for the latest [really tasty Dog Food](#)

Use your mouse to hover your cursor over the above link (with your fingers well away from the buttons) *this is a safe link and will even play you a nice tune*, **but I think you get the point**

If you are in any doubt and do have a genuine order with a company at this time of year, simply do not be tempted to click on any links, visit their genuine website via Google or the known web address and phone or email their customer services.
